CHANGE TO BE EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1960

Brea's are lucky, anyway, according to councilmen. The name change couldn't be more logical. It will become Brea Blvd. Following the announcement, City Clerk Mrs. Young wanted to know if it would be ok to order new stationery needed by the city imprinted with the name and was told to go ahead.
