Franchise For Cable Tv Awarded

BREA — City councilmen Monday night awarded a non-exclusive franchise for CATV (cable TV) to Cable-Corn-General of Southern California.

Subscription rates for the TV service will be \$4.95 a month, which is lower than most cities in the county that have cable television, according to City Manager Wayne Wedin.

The cable system will be installed free in the homes of Brea residents.

The franchise will also have a conduit and wire for an underground fire alarm system installed to city specifications at no cost to the community.

Cable-Corn-General will also establish a complete television

studio within the city for local programming to be telecast to cable antenna subscribers.

The studio is to be completely color-equipped, including such color equipment as color TV cameras and video recorders and the pertinent necessary equipment as well as facilities to allow for the use of movie film and colored slides to be shown through the system.

Brea will be established as the regional headquarters for Cablecom-General, Wedin said.

Installation of the underground cable will begin 30 days from Monday night and complete installation in the city will be completed within an 18 month period.

City staff will also work with the franchise holder to expedite

installation within the city, according to Wedin.

In other matters the council awarded a contract for construction of the city water system, phase one, to Wiggs Construction for \$89,480.

The construction company was the lowest bidder of five considered by the city staff.

The council also approved a resolution confirming the budget transfer of \$3,000 for property purchased for Arovista Park.

The \$3,000 was appropriated from the park fund monies. The purchased land is at Imperial Highway at the entrance to Arovista Park.

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—Sirhan B. Sirhan is so suggestive to hypnosis that on one occasion he was told to act like a monkey and climbed the bars in his cell and swung there, grimacing at his jailers.

Dr. Bernard Diamond, a psychiatrist and university professor, told Sirhan's murder trial jury Monday that when the 25-year-old Arab shot Robert

SAIGON (UPI)—Five flights of B52 bombers battered Communist infiltration routes toward Saigon today amid reports the U.S. command has sought President Nixon's go-ahead for raids against Communist camps in Cambodia, where the infiltration begins.
