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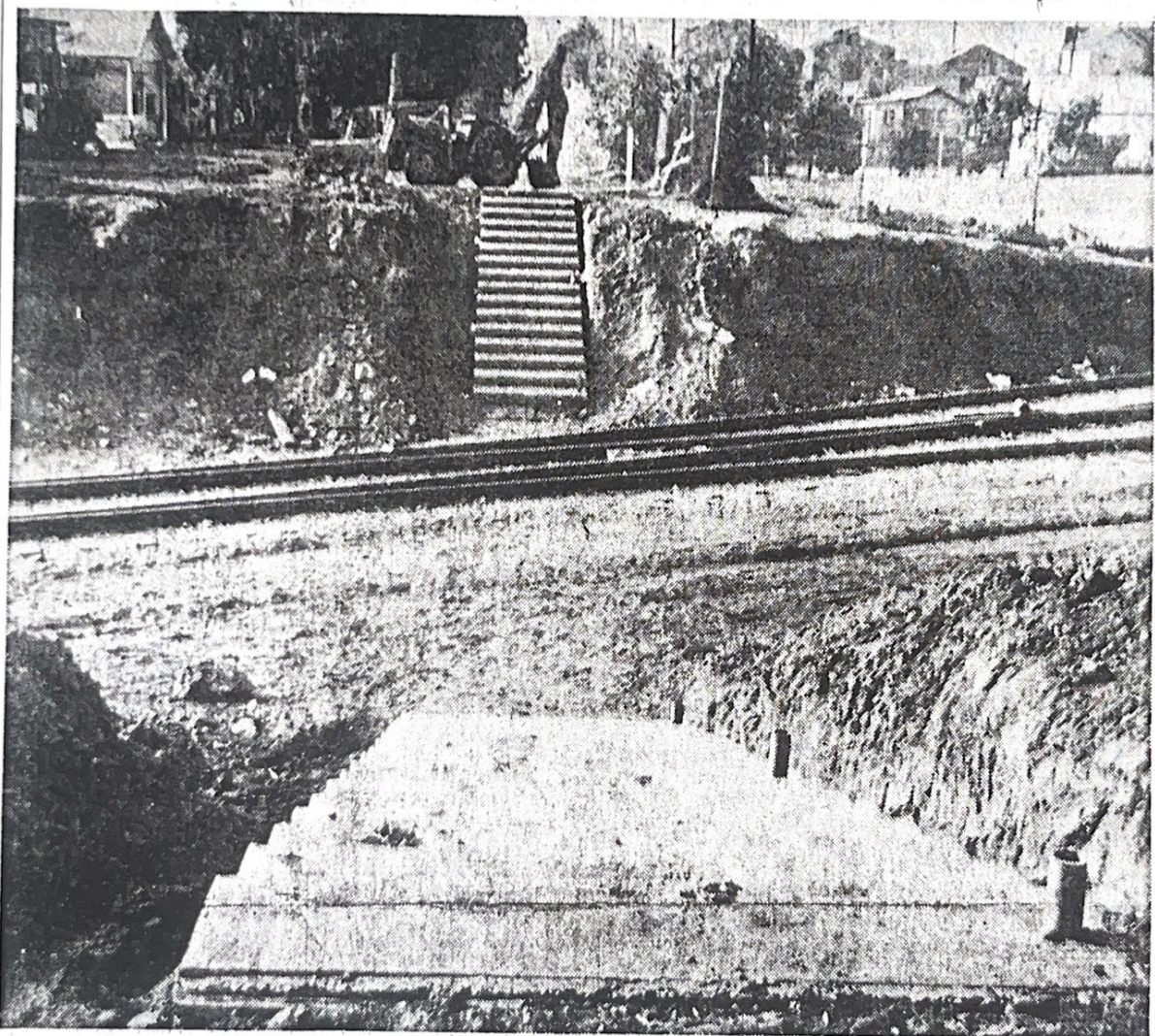
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STEPS TO SAFETY — Here is the walkway which city is building on Orange Ave., from rail-

## To Take Kids Out Of Rush Traffic Peril

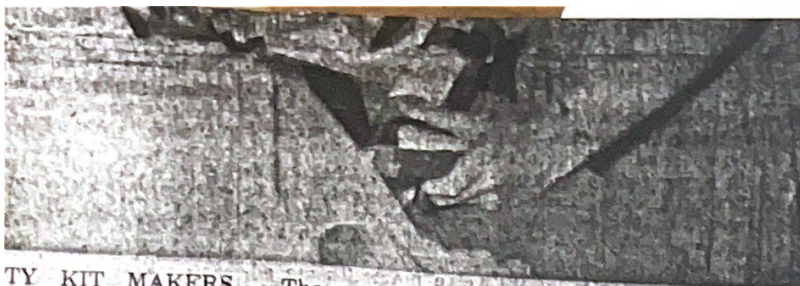
The bike walkway over the Pacific Electric Railway tracks on Orange Ave., which the city council recently authorized may be started next week, Asst. City Engineer Keith Green said today.

Requested by the Parent Teachers Association of the junior high school and Brea Elementary School District trustees, the walkway will take much of the junior high school bicycle traffic off Brea Blvd.




