100 Top Riders, Ropers To Perform in Brea Rodeo

Some of the West's top cowpokes have been signed to appear in Brea's 1st annual Championship Rodeo at Cullen Field, Sunday, August 10.

O. L. (Red) Richey, secretary of the Cowboys' Association of America, stated that more than 100 contestants are planning to participate in the all-day Western show. These performers, together with the members of 25 Southern California riding clubs that will parade through Brea at noon, should provide plenty of excitement for old hands and tenderfeet alike.

All of last year's champions in each of the five events, saddle bronc riding, calf roping, steer wrestling, bareback bronc riding, and team roping, will be on hand, as well as many top local riders and ropers.

The CAA, organized in 1940 to stage rodeos for California, Arizona, Nevada, Texas, and Wyoming, each year awards a gold and silver buckle, value at \$1000 to the all-around champion who has accumulated the most points earned at just such rodeos at the one planned for August 10 in Brea.

Arrangements have been made to accommodate 5000 spectators in the high school stadium by adding 1500 temporary bleacher seats, according to Doug McGill, rodeo chairman of the Lions Club. He also stated that refreshments will be served on the rodeo grounds.

All proceeds from the show will be turned over to the civic improvement fund to help finance development of the proposed 26-acre Brea city park.

Advance ticket sales will start next Friday, July 25, with adults being admitted for \$1.20 and servicemen and kids for 60 cents.
