Los Pinos Youth Camp Faces Threat of Being Shut

SANTA ANA (OCNS) — At a time when the county is fighting a continuing battle to keep its Juvenile Hall from being overcrowded, the 32-bed Los Pinos Forestry Camp has been found to be in danger of being closed.

The 1974-75 County Grand Jury said the facility does not meet the Field Earthquake Safety Act, which requires all school facilities to meet stringent construction standards.

County supervisors Tuesday voted unanimously to refer the problem to the county administrative office, county counsel and director of building services for in-

vestigation, report recommendations to the board.

Los Pinos is operated by the county probation department and department of education for housing boys assigned there through the Juvenile Court process.

The hall will be closed if rehabilitation is not completed soon, the Grand Jury said. The county must adopt detailed plans for repair, reconstruction or replacement and authorize a contract and have work begun by June 30, according to D. Russell Parks, Grand Jury foreman. If the work is not completed

ation will have to be a time extension, which cannot exceed two years.
