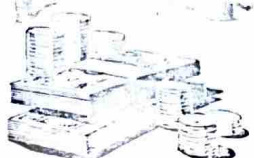

Thirty-Room King Professional
Building Nearly Completed

The King Professional building, located at 330 South Pomona, is nearing completion this week and it is expected will be ready for occupancy the first of October by Dr. J. W. King and his staff.

The 30-room building is designed with consultation room, medical and surgery rooms, x-ray and laboratory rooms, a dental suite, and rooms for diagnosis and treatment. Patients will enter the large, carpeted reception room which has two hallways leading from it to the various treatment rooms. Decorative wall panels and planters will be found in the reception room to make it attractive and modern in design. The entire building will be air-conditioned. Ample parking facilities have been provided at the rear of the building.

Building's Features

Visitors to the building will probably first notice the cleverly decorated signpost with the doctors' "shingles" attached to it. The two metal illustrations of the "country doctor" are appropriate for the building. A unique method of putting the name on the building has also been devised with individual block letters approximately one foot high. These are outlined in shadows with a night lighting effect making the letters stand out in bold relief.

Contractors

The building has been under the general supervision of Henry A. Rudd, general building and cement contractor. Brea. Painting contractor was Erwin K. Schmidt, also of Brea. Landscaping was done by James Boothe of Compton with plants and shrubs from the Keeline-Wilcox Nursery. Streech Electric did the electric work with Bob Snell of Placentia doing the plumbing.

Fullerton Sheet Metal Works and Service Roofing company of Fullerton furnished the roof, with George LaPrairie doing the brick masonry work at the entrance to the building. The chain link fencing was done by La Habra Fence company.

School Roll Hits 229

Drs. King, Wilbur
To Move Into
New Quarters

Dr. J. W. King, M.D., announced this week that his entire staff will be retained in his new location at 330 South Pomona, in the King Professional building, with the addition of Dr. Paul Freeman, X-ray specialist of Santa Ana, who will have regular hours in the building doing X-ray diagnosis work; and Donald Grigg, cardiologist from Los Angeles, who will do electrocardiograph readings.

The regular staff of Dr. King includes Oscar Lund, registered nurse and laboratory and X-ray technician; Mrs. Nina Sprecher, registered nurse, and Mrs. Marjorie Audiss, receptionist. Dr. King said he expects to add other assistants in the future.

Associated

Associated with Dr. King will be Floyd D. Wilbur, M.D. Dr. Wilbur received his B.S. degree at UCLA and his M.D. from USC. He did his intern work at the Orange county hospital. He is also a member of Phi Rho Sigma, the medical fraternity. He served three years as a Navy officer in the Pacific theatre. Dr. and Mrs. Wilbur are now living at 517 Union place, Brea, with their two children, Elaine Ann, 6, and Daniel Wayne, aged 5 1/2 months.

College Work

Dr. King is a graduate of La Sierra college, Arlington, and CME at Loma Vista where he received his M.D. degree. He did two years intern work at the L. A. General hospital. He has a fellowship in orthopedic surgery from CME and served three years with the army in the European and Asiatic theaters doing orthopedic work and surgery. Dr. King is a diplomat of the National Board, a member of the American Academy of general practice, also of the American Medical association and the Orange County Medical association. He came to Brea in 1946 and established his office in rooms in the Brea hotel building. He removed his offices in 1950 to the 700 South Pomona building from which he is moving the first of the month.

Long-time Friends

Dr. King and Dr. Wilbur knew each other in their high school days and it was quite natural that they should become associated with each other following Dr. Wilbur's internship. Dr. and Mrs. King live at 418 Eucalyptus with their four children.
