# N. Viet Oil Lifeline **Smashed**

SAIGON (UPI) -U.S. Navy pilots smashed oil storage tanks at the edge of the North Vietnamese lifeline port of Haiphong, and in South Vietnam American marines killed 100 my Communists including some to strapped to their weapons, military spokesmen said today.

Lt. (J.G.) Nick Carpenter of na Cincinnati, Ohlo, one of the A6 Intruder pilots striking the Halphong oil tanks Monday, said the flak was heavy but Navy bombs hit the oil depot and "a huge orange fireball bounced up.'

The attack, part of a U.S. 107mission air assault against the Communist country's war arsenal, marked the return of American planes for the first time in weeks to the port city through which virtually all of Hanoi's imported arms come.

### Fire truck donated to sister city

Brea's Sister City of Lagos de Moreno, Mexico has a "new" fire truck thanks to the generosity of the Brea City Council and the Brea Rotary Club. Mayor Carrey Nelson had the honor of delivering the "pink slip" for a 1966 Crown fire pumper truck to Atilano Marquez, representing the Mayor of Lagos. At the same time, Bernie Dunlap, Director of International Service for the Brea Rotary Club, delivered a check for \$1 to complete the transaction.

Most recently, the truck was being used by the Brea Fire Department as a reserve unit. However, after the recent purchase of a brand-new pumper truck, the city decided to retire the aging, yet functional, 1966 Crown from its fleet. In a gesture of goodwill and friendship, the unit was offered to Lagos, a small rural community with very limited funds.
