N. Viet Oil Lifeline Smashed

SAIGON (UPI) — U.S. Navy
pilots smashed oil storage tanks
at the edge of the North
Vietnamese lifeline port of
Haiphong, and in South Vietnam
American marines killed 100
Communists including some
strapped to their weapons,
military spokesmen said today.

Lt. (J.G.) Nick Carpenter of
Cincinnati, Ohio, one of the A6
Intruder pilots striking the
Haiphong oil tanks Monday,
said the flak was heavy but
Navy bombs hit the oil depot
and "a huge orange fireball
bounced up."

The attack, part of a U.S. 107-
mission air assault against the
Communist country's war arsenal,
marked the return of
American planes for the first
time in weeks to the port city
through which virtually all of
Hanoi's imported arms come.

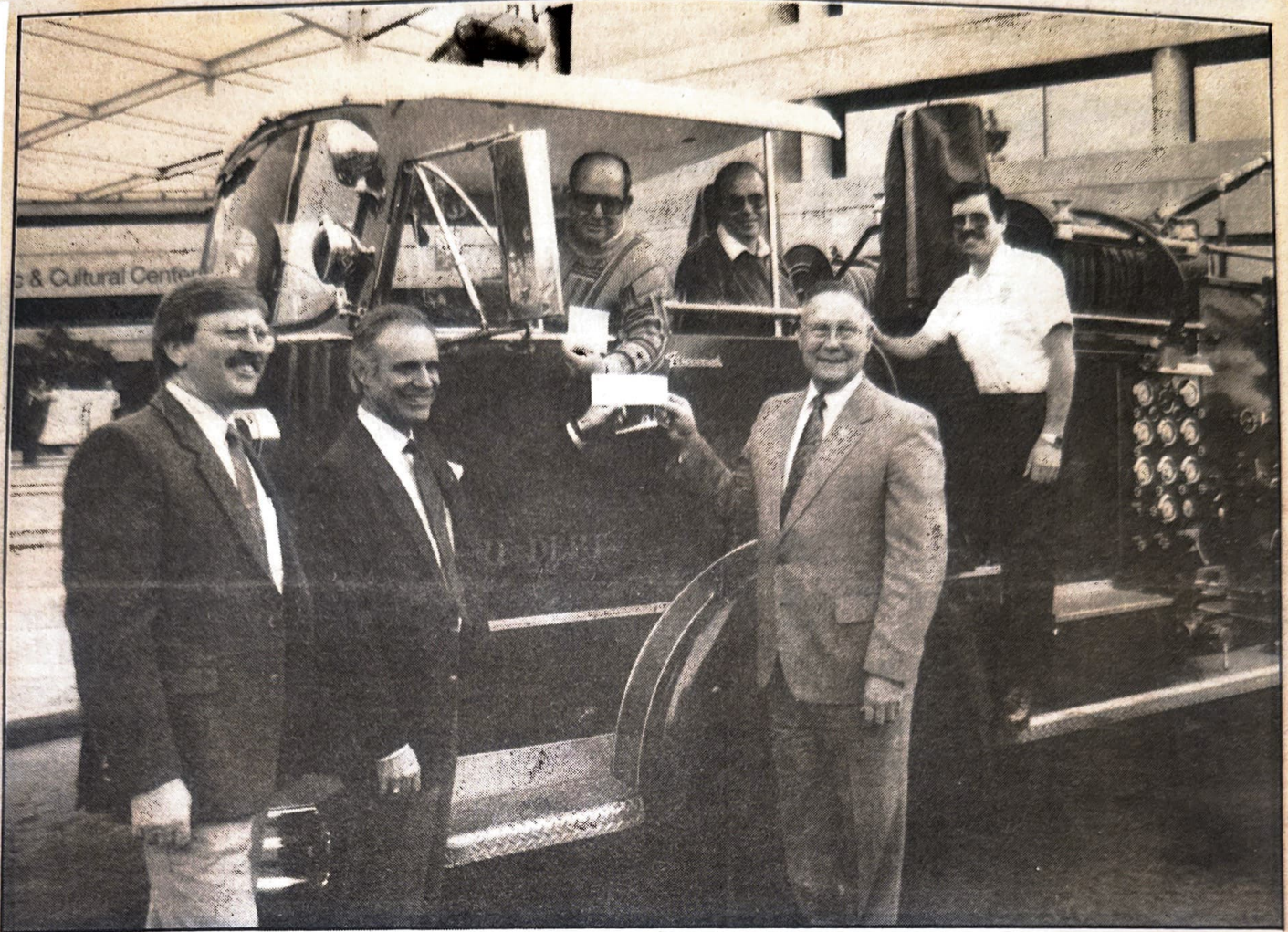
Find Communists' Bodies

Just below the North Vietna-
mese border, U.S. Marines
reported finding the bodies of
100 Communists after bitter
fighting that cost six Leather-
necks killed and 28 wounded.

They said some Communists
had been strapped to sandbags
to keep them from fleeing.
Others, apparently wounded,
had been tied to their weapons
for the suicidal task of halting
Marines charging at them up
the slopes of Con Thien
mountain.

The worst moment for the
Leathernecks came Sunday
when Communist ambushers
almost wiped out a U.S.-
Vietnamese patrol of 16 men.

American spokesmen said
about 120 Communists jumped
the patrol which had left camp
only 10 minutes before. One of
the six Vietnamese lived and,

Fire truck donated to sister city

Brea's Sister City of Lagos de Moreno, Mexico has a "new" fire truck thanks to the generosity of the Brea City Council and the Brea Rotary Club. Mayor Carrey Nelson had the honor of delivering the "pink slip" for a 1966 Crown fire pumper truck to Atilano Marquez, represent-

ing the Mayor of Lagos. At the same time, Bernie Dunlap, Director of International Service for the Brea Rotary Club, delivered a check for \$1 to complete the transaction.

Most recently, the truck was being used by the Brea Fire Department as a reserve unit. However, after the re-

cent purchase of a brand-new pumper truck, the city decided to retire the aging, yet functional, 1966 Crown from its fleet. In a gesture of goodwill and friendship, the unit was offered to Lagos, a small rural community with very limited funds.
