

# City to mark Jubilee with picnic, parade

In celebration of its 75th anniversary, the city of Brea will host a Diamond Jubilee Parade and Community Picnic, beginning at 10 a.m. Saturday, May 16.

The parade will feature a high school marching band competition, floats, drill teams, equestrian units, local youth and community organizations, fire engine companies and antique automobiles. Various elected state and local officials also will ride in the parade, along with an Honorary Grand Marshal — a citizen from the community to be selected at the May 5 City Council meeting by random drawing.

The one-mile parade route will begin on Birch Street, west of State College Boulevard (by the entrance to the Brea Mall), travel west on Birch and end at north Brea Boulevard.

Following the parade, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., will be an old-fashioned community picnic, held at City Hall Park. Residents and Brea businesses are

invited to bring families, neighbors and friends.

Featured entertainment will be a performance by the "Rock-a-Dillies" (presenting 1950s-style music); a fun zone for children, complete with pony and train rides; and various old-time games for people of all ages. Also, various refreshments will be available for a nominal fee, provided by local service organizations.

Applications are being accepted for parade participation. Citizens interested in entering the Honorary Grand Marshal drawing should send their name, address and telephone number, along with a \$5 entry fee (\$2 for senior citizens age 60 or older) to the Brea Diamond Jubilee Committee, c/o the Brea Community Services Department, No. 1 Civic Center Circle, 92621. 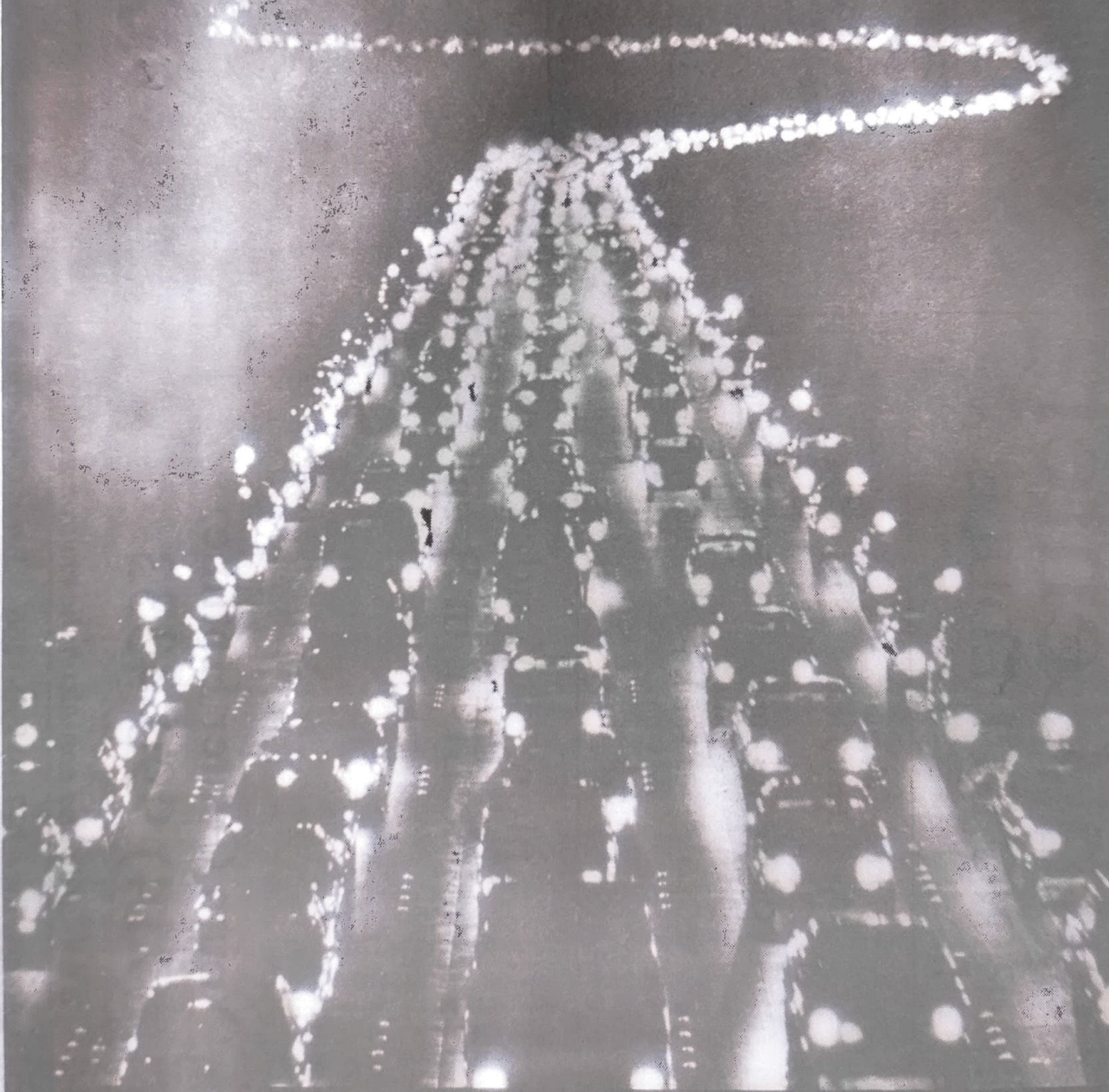

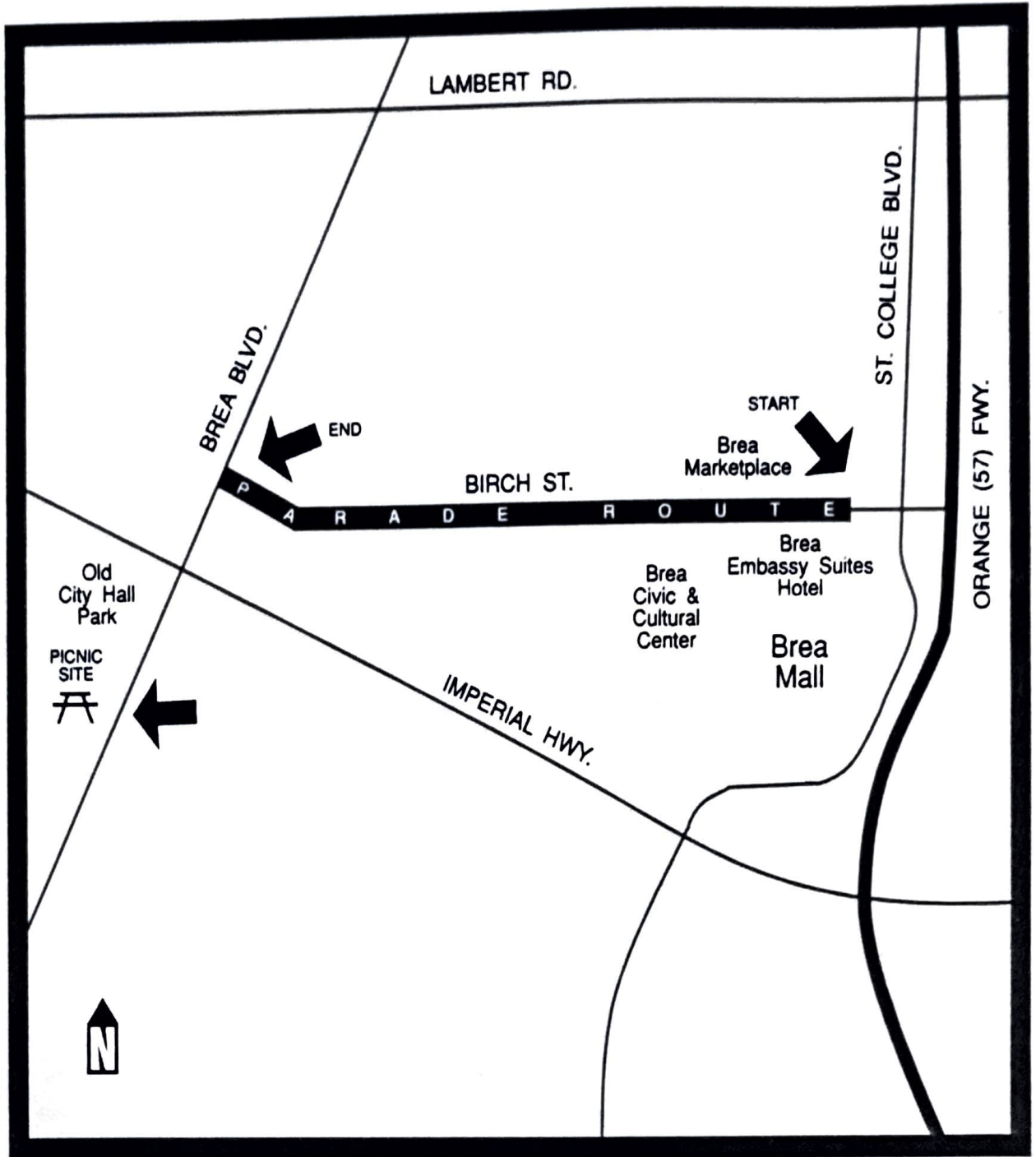

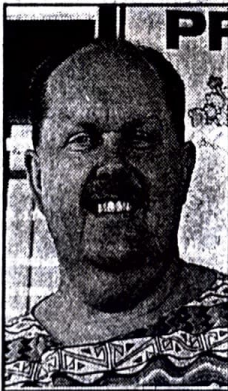
