Tribute will be paid in Brea to Dr. Curtis

BREA — The Civic-Cultural Center Performing Arts Theater will be dedicated Saturday to the memory of Dr. Glenn Curtis.

Dr. Curtis, who called himself "Brea's country doctor," died 24 years ago. But the City Council decided last October to recognize his contributions to the community by naming the theater after him.

The public is invited to the 2:30 p.m. dedication which will feature the unveiling of Dr. Curtis' portrait and a dedicatory plaque.

Dr. Curtis practiced medicine in Brea from 1927 until 1958 when

ill health forced him to retire.

One of his major accomplishments in North Orange County was his involvement in helping to form and found St. Jude Hospital and Rehabilitation Center in Fullerton. He also was a member of its staff.

His other involvements in the medical field included being a member of the professional ethics and public relations committee of Loma Linda University, a member of the American Medical Association, organizing and directing the California Physicians' Blue Shield, president of the Orange County Medical Association and serving

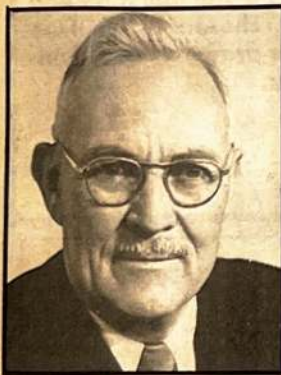
Dyer Bennett told the audience Dr. Glenn Curtis was the greatest guy he ever met.

Mary McGulre, Chairwoman of the Cultural Arts Commission, profusely thanked the weatherman in a lighter vane.

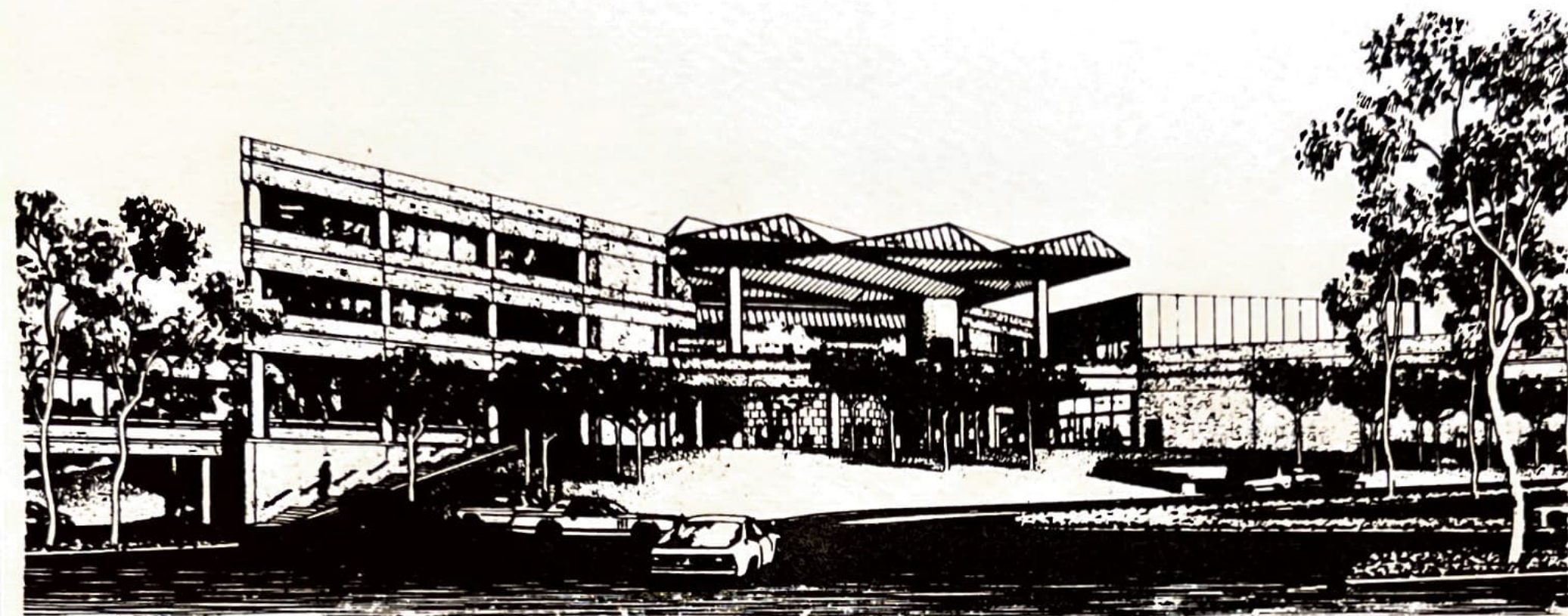
Before unveiling the portrait, Curtis, was honored with a Resolution from Loma Linda University.

Theater Opening Is Black-Tie Event

It was an important evening for supporters of the Cabaret Repertory Theater, executives from Cal State Fullerton and the City of Brea when the 199-seat theater of the Brea Civic Cultural Center opened with the musical comedy "I Do! I Do!" starring Amy Sheridan and Don Edbright.

Brea Pioneer To Be Honored At Dedication Ceremony

A dedication and reception is scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 14, 2:30 p.m. at the Brea Civic Cultural Center, Performing Arts Theatre in memory of Dr. Glenn Curtis.

In October 1981, the Brea City Council took the first step towards recognizing Brea's past and bringing it into the future for all to share. The council, acting on a recommendation of the Cultural Arts Commission, moved to honor one of Brea's pioneers by naming the theatre in the Brea Civic Cultural Center; the Dr. Glenn Curtis Performing Arts Theatre.

Dr. Curtis established his practice in Brea in 1927 continuing until 1958 when ill health forced his early retirement; he succumbed in 1959. He

became known as one of the outstanding general practitioners in northern Orange County but referred to himself as "Brea's Country Doctor."

His activities reached out from the then small community where he lived so that many patients came from larger towns and even metropolitan areas to seek his help. These included the rich and the poor, no one was denied admittance or attention.

Although his life as a doctor was a busy one, he managed to find time for many other pursuits, including his abiding interest and love for the arts. He was intensely interested in community, civic and governmental affairs.

Many county and state officials knew him and valued his support and advice. It was his far-reaching acquaintances that produced for him an appointment by the State Department as a director of the Institute of Inter American Affairs in Ecuador.

Curtis recognized the need for a regional hospital in North Orange County and was in-

strumental in the forming and founding of St. Jude Hospital and Rehabilitation Center in Fullerton, where he also was on staff.

Curtis graduated from Union College in Nebraska and entered the College of Medical Evangelists in Loma Linda (Loma Linda University) and graduated with the class of 1924, where he holds the honor of Distinguished Alumni and was a member of the professional ethics and public relations committee of that university for many years. He was a member of the AMA, the organizer and Director of California Physician's Blue Shield, President of Orange County Medical Association and President of California Public Health League.

Curtis was one of the first guarantors of the Los Angeles Civic Light Opera Series, which guaranteed the financial support of this endeavor years before it moved from the old Philharmonic Theatre to the Los Angeles Music Center where he and his wife Bernice served as

charter members and patrons.

In 1939 he joined as a charter member in forming the Orange County Coin Club; the fourth coin club to be organized in California. As the first permanent secretary and spark plug of the club, he was one of the group that proposed and later established the California State Numismatic Association. His many community service involvements included president, Brea Lions Club; president, Brea Post of the American Legion, and a World War I veteran; member of Brea Citrol Lodge F. & A.M.; and member of Noble Mystic Shrine, Al Malaikah Temple.

The afternoon event will include participation from his past associations, and community members who knew him. The unveiling of his portrait and dedicatory plaque will highlight the program. Light refreshments will be served. The public is invited, especially the many who were his friends.

Currently there is \$222.10 left in the Curtis Memorial Fund. My feeling is that this should be expanded to provide for an annual scholarship to a Brea Olinda High School student interested in pursuing a cultural arts career. 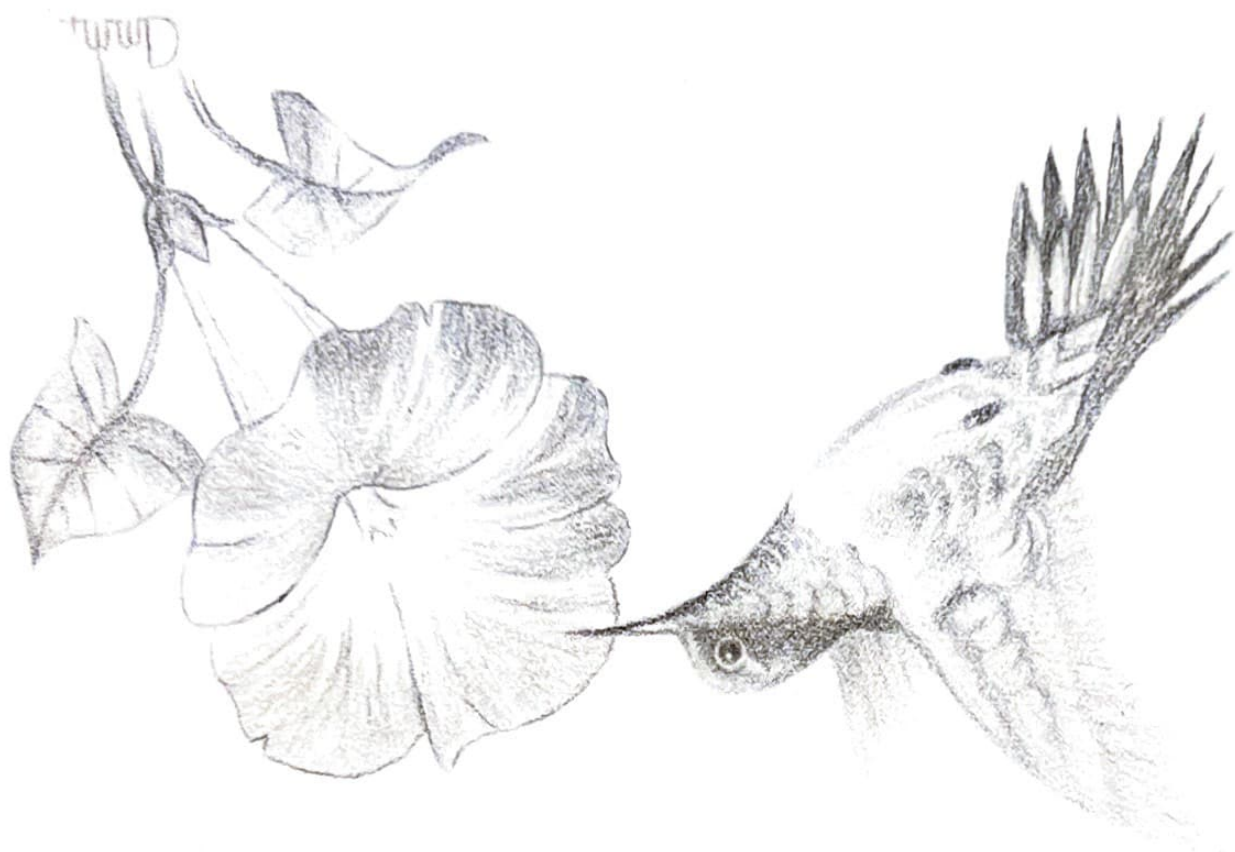

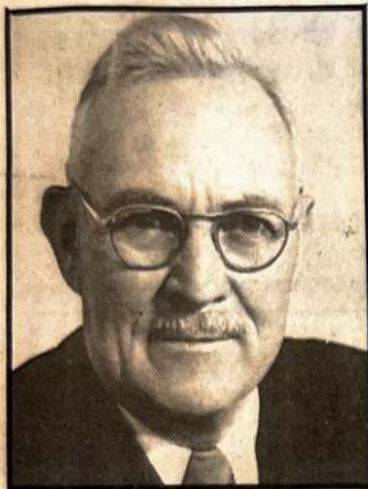

...because he said it would be "in-comfortable" with the neighborhood community.

However, council members pointed out that the business, run in conjunction with the beauty salon, had no sexual overtones and that it would be for therapeutic purposes only.

Councilman Mel Le Baron said the business was not related to massage parlors and that he "didn't understand why it was an issue."

"I've had massage treatments

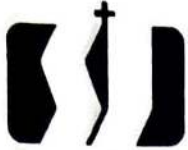

Acknowledgements are long overdue for your contribution to the Dr. Curtis Theatre. The delay has been with the City Staff working on the proper identification of the building. Our agreement with the City Council was that we would properly identify the building without cost to the City.

It appears now that we will present to the City Council in March the following for approval:

1. A bronze marker, 18" x 18", in keeping with the others about the building. This would be placed on the outside of the theatre to the left of the entrance. It would bear the following inscription:


"Dedicated to the People of Brea in Memory
of C. Glenn Curtis, M.D., Brea's Country
Doctor, Humanitarian, Patron of the Arts,
1894 - 1959".


2. An oil portrait of Dr. Curtis, 24" x 30", plus frame. It would be a head and shoulders portrait to be done by Pamela Mason of Taos, New Mexico. The frame would be an appropriate gold leaf in keeping with the contemporary gold leaf mirror. The portrait would be placed in the center of the wall to left, in the foyer. It would be facing the mirror. A name place would be placed under the portrait bearing only the inscription - "C. Glenn Curtis, M.D. 1894 - 1959".
3. Upgraded, perhaps gold letters on the glass front of the theatre to the left of the entrance, giving the name of the theatre: "Dr. Glenn Curtis Performing Arts Theatre".

If adequate funds can be arranged our hope is to establish a scholarship fund in the name of Dr. Curtis to be awarded annually to a deserving Brea student.
