Dear Ted:

At our recent "State of the City" briefing for former Councilmen, you asked me the question: "How on earth did you fellows manage to get that park named for me?" I would like to take this opportunity to tell you just how we fellows did manage to do this. My sole purpose in relating this to you is to share this experience as I lived it for the purpose of your entertainment at the present, knowing that with your extensive experiences in "country politics" that you will enjoy re-living this with me. In addition, I know your great grandchildren and other descendants will be as proud of your role in State and Orange County history as you are of the role played by your father in the growth of this area. Perhaps this honor to you will enhance this opinion. Needless to say, we think the honor is well deserved and worth every effort it took to accomplish.

In May 1972 the City Council of the City of Brea made their annual sojourn to Sacramento. And, as usual, you had made the necessary appointments with Senators, Representatives, State Highway officials, etc. Although this was my second trip to the Capital representing the City, I was still very impressed with the outstanding reception that you had arranged. We were treated royally in every respect---punctual meetings, cordial receptions, available officials for us to call on---we couldn't have asked for more. The pre-planning that had been done was obvious to each of us. As a result of these meetings, Brea representatives returned home feeling our goals had been accomplished.

During the return flight from Sacramento, as we were recalling and reviewing our meetings, I made an "off the cuff" remark to City Manager Wayne Wedin, "We should do something meaningful for Ted in appreciation for the many such meetings

he has arranged in the past." Lightheartedly Wayne replied, "We do have an alley we could name "Craig Alley". We both chuckled and that ended the dialog. Later that night (11:15 p.m. to be precise) while lying in bed pondering over my earlier remark to Wayne, I was struck with the idea of The Ted Craig Regional Park. I thought the idea so great that I immediately picked up the phone and called Wayne. After explaining my idea to him, I remarked, "If anyone can shoot down this idea I'll be surprised." Wayne was in total agreement. It was at this point that we went to work.

At the next City Council meeting I read a statement which is covered in the enclosed minutes. This statement was to set the stage for the following sequence of events. I felt that politically the request should not emanate from the City of Brea, but rather that it should come from another city in close proximity to the area, so as you "politicians" would say, I went to the "bank" and asked my good friend Robert Finnell, Mayor of Placentia, to author a resolution to the Board of Supervisors with copies to be sent to all Orange County cities proposing the Ted Craig Regional Park. Bob responded as I knew he would and the public drive for recognition was under way. He and I both received inquiries from local news media questioning "why". Bob, silvery tongued as we know him to be, parried all questions with finesse. One newspaper had been previously given the story in order to probe the weak spots and had found none. I was able to answer straightforwardly to the fact that Ted had been Mayor of Brea, Speaker of the House, Representative of Orange County in Sacramento, and had contributed greatly to the County, especially North Orange County, and that the honor of having his contributions remembered with a Park named for him was richly deserved.

It was then only a matter of contacting Mayors and Councilmen of the various cities who had previously received copies of the Placentia resolution. I requested these Mayors to send similar resolutions to the Board of Supervisors supporting the name change from Fullerton Dam Regional Park to the Ted Craig Regional Park, Fullerton. During this period, I contacted Supervisor William Phillips of

the Third District, who happened to be running for reelection and conveyed to him the fact that I felt this would be a great vote getter in the City of Brea. Many calls were made re-informing Bill of the above fact. Ted, as you will know, the name change was first mentioned in an official capacity by the County when a "trumped up" deed transfer transpired on the park site between a Colonel from the Corp of Army Engineers and Supervisor William Phillips. Normally this transfer would not have transpired until the dedication. Time being of essence, however, Supervisor Phillips was spurred into taking this action when he did. As you may recall, having attended that ceremony, I read a statement alluding to the Ted Craig Regional Park. This set the stage for Bill to present his request for the name change at the next meeting of the Board of Supervisors and to request that this recommendation be sent to the Harbors, Beaches and Parks Commission for their recommendation. As a member of this Commission, sitting with a Commissioner appointed by Supervisor Phillips, I had only to muster one vote in order to carry the recommendation, it being a 5 man board. The Director of the Harbor, Beaches and Parks Department had been briefed beforehand and had agreed to present the request in an objective manner. Then I was to do the rest. You will be pleased to know the vote was unanimous in favor of the recommended name change to Ted Craig Regional Park. This recommendation was returned to the Board of Supervisors where it met the same response --- a 5-0 vote.

The ending is yet to be written, Ted, but I do hope you have enjoyed sharing this experience with me. For my part, it has been one of the highlights of my term on the Brea City Council.

At the suggestion of Councilman MacKain the Staff was directed to write a letter to the Police Department and Captain Dove commending the Department on the fine job they did during the Bonanza Days and, also, to congratulate the Chamber of Commerce for the success of Bonanza Days.

TED CRAIG

The Mayor requested that the Council and Staff give thought to finding some meaningful way to honor Mr. Ted Craig for his many years of service in the government and for his special help to the City of Brea. Mr. Craig is the man responsible for the Council meeting with our legislators in Sacramento every year for the purpose of discussing Brea's problems. He is the only Speaker of the House to come from Orange County and also the youngest Speaker of the House.

8:30 p.m. - A motion was made by Councilman Kowalski, seconded by Councilman Cooper and carried that the meeting adjourn.

GROUNDBREAKING

FULLERTON DAM REGIONAL PARK

OCTOBER 12, 1972

IT IS WITH GREAT PLEASURE THAT I AM HERE TODAY TO TAKE PART IN THE TRANSFER BY LEASE AGREEMENT OF 92 ACRES OF FEDERAL PROPERTY TO THE COUNTY. YOU KNOW, WHEN YOU WORK ON A PROJECT FOR OVER SIX YEARS, YOU SOMETIMES WONDER IF THE PROJECT WILL EVER BECOME A REALITY. BUT, THIS OCCASION TODAY ATTESTS TO THE VALIDITY OF BEING TENACIOUS.

ACTUALLY, THE WORK ON CREATING FULLERTON DAM REGIONAL PARK BEGAN ALMOST TEN YEARS AGO WHEN THIS SITE WAS PLACED IN THE MASTER PLAN OF REGIONAL PARKS. THE BRIDGES THAT HAVE BEEN CROSSED SINCE THAT TIME ARE MANY; AND A BRIEF LISTING OF THE STEPS THAT HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN REACHING OUR PRESENT STATUS ON THIS PROJECT ARE IN ORDER:

1. IN 1965 DEFINITIVE STUDIES WERE MADE TO DETERMINE EXACT CONFIGURATION OF THE PARK PROJECT. THESE STUDIES DETERMINED THAT IN ADDITION TO THE FEDERAL PROPERTIES WITHIN THE BASIN OF FULLERTON DAM AN ADDITIONAL 33 ACRES OUT OF THE BASIN WOULD HAVE TO BE ACQUIRED FOR THE PARK.
2. IN 1966, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AUTHORIZED APPLICATION FOR A STATE GRANT OF \$382,000 TO FUND 50 PERCENT OF THE ACQUISITION COST OF THESE 33 ACRES.
3. IN 1968, WORD WAS RECEIVED FROM THE STATE THAT THE GRANT APPLICATION OF THE COUNTY HAD BEEN APPROVED.

4. IN 1969, THE COUNTY BUDGETED \$760,000 TO ACQUIRE THE 33 ACRES, AND THAT YEAR THE LAND WAS PURCHASED.
5. IN 1970, DEVELOPMENT FUNDS WERE BUDGETED FOR THE PURPOSE OF HIRING CONSULTANTS TO PREPARE THE DEVELOPMENT PLANS FOR THE FULLERTON DAM REGIONAL PARK. THEN, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RETAINED THE FULLERTON BASED FIRM OF CHARLES WICKETT AND ASSOCIATES TO PREPARE SUCH PLANS.
6. SINCE THAT TIME, WICKETT AND ASSOCIATES HAVE BEEN HARD AT WORK PREPARING PLANS AND COORDINATING THIS PREPARATION WITH THE U. S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS, THE COUNTY HARBORS, BEACHES AND PARKS COMMISSION, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AND THE GOOD CITIES OF FULLERTON AND BREA.
7. AS THE PLANS WERE NEARING COMPLETION, WE FINALIZED THE DISCUSSIONS WITH COLONEL ROPER OF THE CORPS OF ENGINEERS AND HIS STAFF, INCLUDING LT. COL. METALIOUS WHO IS HERE TODAY, TO FACILITATE THE TRANSFER BY LEASE OF THE FEDERAL PROPERTY TO THE COUNTY; THE EVENT WHICH BRINGS US ALL HERE TODAY.

THIS LIST SOUNDS RATHER SIMPLE AND UNEVENTFUL, BUT BELIEVE ME, WE HAVE ALL PUT IN A GOOD DEAL OF LONG HOURS IN STUDYING AND NEGOTIATING AND PLANNING FOR THIS PROJECT. A TREMENDOUS AMOUNT OF TEAMWORK HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED, INVOLVING THE CORPS OF ENGINEERS, THE STATE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT, THE COUNTY, AND THE CITIES OF FULLERTON AND BREA. MAYOR FOX OF BREA AND MAYOR ROOT OF FULLERTON HAVE BEEN INSTRUMENTAL IN THIS COORDINATED EFFORT, WHICH CLEARLY ILLUSTRATES THE MUTUAL INTEREST AND CONCERN OF ALL LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT.

THE CITIZENS OF NORTH ORANGE COUNTY NEED THIS FACILITY VERY MUCH--THIS IS WHY I HAVE PERSONALLY WORKED SO HARD TO MAKE IT BECOME A REALITY. THERE HAVE BEEN MANY PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED ALONG THE WAY WHICH WE HAVE HAD TO OVERCOME IN ORDER TO DEVELOP THE PARK. ROAD ALIGNMENTS HAVE BEEN RE-ROUTED, OIL EASEMENTS AND MINERAL RIGHTS HAVE BEEN CHANGED AND, INDEED, THE PARK CONFIGURATION HAS BEEN ADJUSTED SEVERAL TIMES.

BUT, I AM NOT FINISHED YET ON THIS PROJECT; FAR MORE NEEDS TO BE DONE. WITHIN THE LAST 30 DAYS WE HAVE FOUND THAT A STRONG POSSIBILITY EXISTS THAT THE EXISTING OIL WELLS AND OIL LINES CAN BE COMPLETELY REMOVED. ORIGINALLY, IT WAS THOUGHT THAT THE EXISTING OIL WELLS WOULD HAVE TO REMAIN AND SIMPLY BE SCREENED BY PLANTING AND FENCING, WHILE THE MANY OIL LINES WHICH BISECT THE PROPERTY WOULD HAVE TO BE BURIED. INDEED, \$300,000 WAS BUDGETED SIMPLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PLACING ALL EXISTING OIL LINES UNDERGROUND!

SO NOW, WE ARE WORKING WITH THE OWNERS OF THE OIL WELLS AND OIL EASEMENTS FOR THE COMPLETE REMOVAL OF ALL THESE FACILITIES. IT IS PROBABLE THAT THE COUNTY CAN PURCHASE THE RIGHTS TO THESE WELLS AND LINES FOR CONSIDERABLY LESS THAN THE \$300,000 BUDGETED TO UNDERGROUND THEM! IF THIS OCCURS, AND REST ASSURED THAT I AM MAKING EVERY EFFORT TO SEE THAT IT DOES, FULLERTON DAM REGIONAL PARK WILL HAVE A COMPLETE PARK-LIKE ENVIRONMENT, FREE OF ANY INDUSTRIAL ENCROACHMENTS. THE IMPACT OF THIS UPON THE PARK DEVELOPMENT AND THE ENVIRONMENT OF THE PARK ITSELF CANNOT BE OVERESTIMATED. IF I HAVE MY WAY, FULLERTON DAM REGIONAL PARK WILL BE THE MOST BEAUTIFUL AREA OF OPEN SPACE AND GREENERY IN NORTHERN ORANGE COUNTY.

WE HAVE \$1,500,000 BUDGETED THIS FISCAL YEAR FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE FIRST PHASE OF THIS 125-ACRE PARK. WITH TRANSFER OF THE FEDERAL PROPERTY TODAY, AND THE IMMINENT SOLUTION TO THE OIL WELL AND OIL LINE PROBLEMS, WORK CAN SOON BEGIN

ON THE ACTUAL CONSTRUCTION OF THIS FACILITY!

WHAT ARE WE GOING TO GET FOR ONE AND A HALF MILLION DOLLARS IN THIS FIRST PHASE DEVELOPMENT? WHAT WILL THE CITIZENS OF NORTHERN ORANGE COUNTY HAVE IN THE WAY OF PARK FACILITIES? WELL, LET ME LIST WHAT IS PLANNED IN THIS FIRST PHASE: . . .

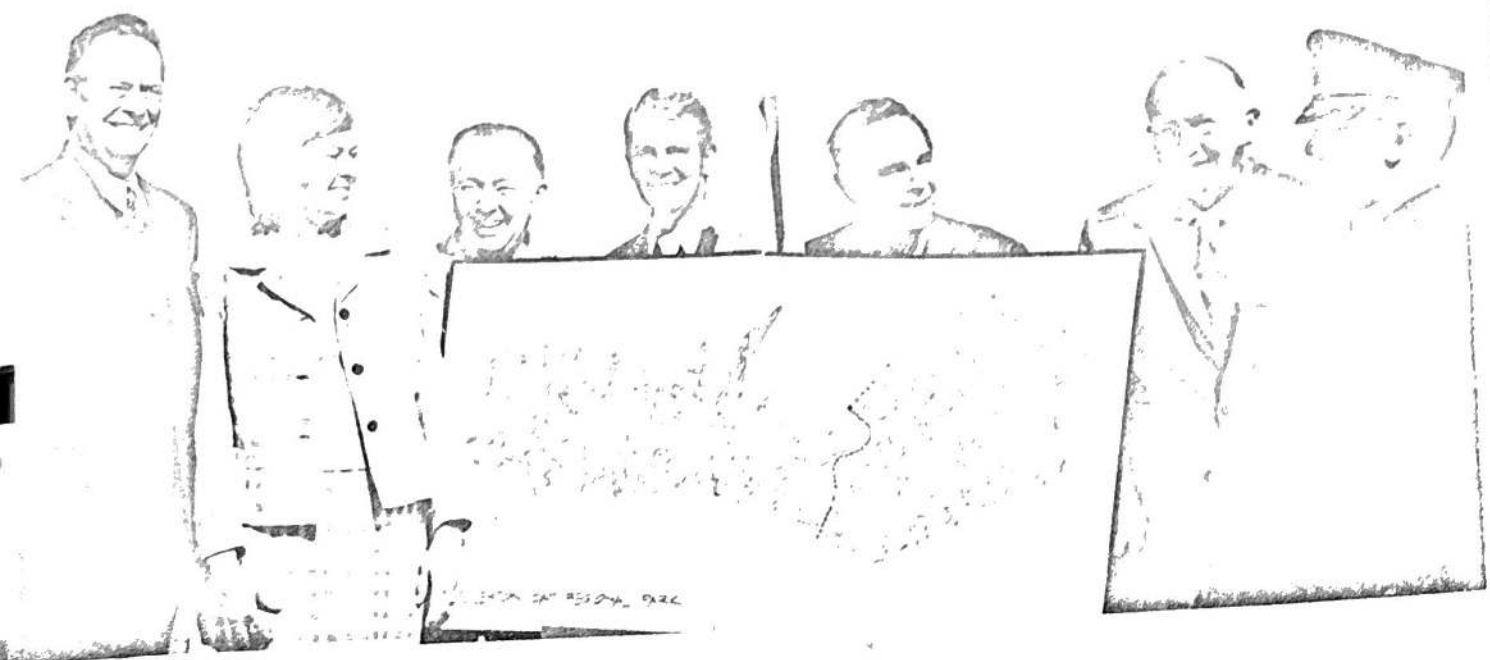

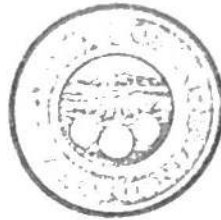

NARRATIVE: Requests have been made to name Fullerton Dam Regional Park as the Ted Craig Regional Park-Fullerton, and monies have been budgeted for construction of the park in this fiscal year.

Gentlemen:

Many cities in this County have requested that this County change the name of the Fullerton Dam Regional Park to "Ted Craig Regional Park-Fullerton."

In this regard, my office has received requests from Brea, Fullerton, La Habra, and Placentia, which Cities are in the immediate vicinity of Fullerton Dam, and several other Orange County cities have also supported such change.

Ted Craig has been a resident of Orange County for over 70 years. He served as a councilman and mayor of the City of Brea. He served in the California State Assembly and in 1935 he was selected as one of the youngest men to hold the office of the Speaker of the State Assembly. Mr. Craig has further ably served as the County's legislative advocate for the past seven years.

I believe that it would be most appropriate that this Board consider adopting this recommendation and name this park for Ted Craig.

RECOMMENDATION: This Board refer this proposal to the Harbors, Beaches, and Parks Commission to study the request and report their recommendation to this Board within a period of 30 days.

Funds for the project are available in the District's ACO budget to cover the appraisal costs, option payment, and first increment upon exercise of the option. The District would anticipate budgeting annually for the time purchase increments. Other mention was made that following the appraisal, and after Starr Ranch becomes a project of the District, the necessary Environmental Impact Statement would be prepared. When queried, Mr. Poindexter further stated that he felt that it could be worked out whereby the appraisal would be mutually acceptable to both parties, and that the property would not be available for public use during the option period.

MOTION: Commissioner Robinson moved that it be recommended to the Board of Supervisors to have an appraisal prepared of the lower half of Starr Ranch, as suggested by the Department of Real Property Services. Seconded by Commissioner O'Keefe, and unanimously carried by the Commissioners present.

FULLERTON DAM REGIONAL PARK

In accordance with the Board of Supervisors instructions of October 17, the Commission was requested to consider the renaming of Fullerton Dam Regional Park to Ted Craig Regional Park-Fullerton, and to report its findings back to the Board within 30 days. The major portion of the park falls within the city limits of Fullerton; however, the Cities of Brea, Placentia and Yorba Linda are all in accord with the suggested renaming of Ted Craig Regional Park-Fullerton. In its discussion, the Commission concluded that the name should be changed to Craig Regional Park-Fullerton in the interest of simplicity and in keeping with the practice to drop the first name when the park is named for an individual; e.g., Featherly Regional Park, Irvine Park and O'Neill Park. Mr. Ted Craig is well deserved of the honor having been born in Brea; was the youngest Speaker to ever preside in the State Assembly; was a Brea City Councilman, and served as Mayor of Brea at one time. His father before him was equally renowned, giving more importance to the name of Craig.

MOTION: Commissioner Fox moved it be recommended to the Board of Supervisors to rename Fullerton Dam Regional Park to "Craig Regional Park-Fullerton" in honor of Mr. Ted Craig, well known politically throughout the County and State. Seconded by Commissioner Robinson, and unanimously carried by the Commissioners present.

YORBA REGIONAL PARK

Mr. Ronald Paige of Recreation Systems, Inc., consultants for Yorba Regional Park, reviewed the schematics and estimated costs for the Yorba Regional Park project. The park lies generally south of existing Featherly Regional Park, is a part of the Santa Ana River Greenbelt concept, and consists of approximately 150 acres along one and a half miles of Santa Ana River bank on one side and bounded by La Palma Avenue extension on the other. The width varies from 1,200 feet wide to less than 400 feet at either end. There do not appear to be any particular problems, except to design for possible inundation from a major storm because of being within the flood plain.

# Fullerton Park Renamed For Ted Craig

BREA — The Fullerton Dam Regional Park site was officially renamed Tuesday in honor of long-time Brea resident, and one-time mayor, Ted Craig.

The 125-acre site was renamed by a vote of the County Supervisors for the man who became the youngest Speaker of the State Assembly in 1935, and now represents the county as a legislative advocate in Sacramento.

Supervisor Bill Phillips made the request to the Supervisors that the name be changed in honor of Craig, and Brea Mayor Don Fox was also a driving force behind the original effort for the name change. Several North Orange County cities have gone on record in support of the change.

The site is proposed as a 56-acre park location, and \$1.5 million has been allocated for the development, which will include picnic areas, camp sites, archery range, bike trails, and a seven acre lake.

The county recently acquired more than 91 acres under a lease from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers which was added to another 33 acres purchased by the county last year. The park will be called Craig Regional Park-Fullerton.

The park is located adjacent to Erea, in Fullerton, near the intersection of Imperial Highway and State College Boulevard, in Fullerton.

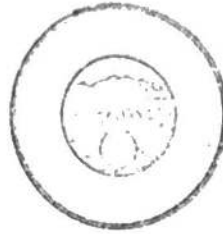
Representatives from Brea, Fullerton, Placentia, and Yorba Linda recently attended a ceremony accepting the land from the federal government at the park site. Supervisor Phillips publicly announced his intention to push for the name change at that time, and the announcement was met with applause from the multi-city gathering. STATE GRANT 830-102, \$382,500: On April 9, 1968 the County of Orange was granted \$590,000 under the State Beach, Park, Recreation and Historical Facilities Act to acquire 33 acres of the proposed Fullerton Dam Regional Park. Approval of this grant was given under the condition that Orange County present evidence of a long term development and use permit from the Corps of Engineers for adjacent Corps land. The Corps land was to be used for recreation purposes.

The 33-acre purchase took place in October of 1969. The grant amount was subsequently amended downward (\$382,500) to reflect a savings realized in the purchase price. Shortly thereafter, in January 1970, a request for payment of grant funds was processed with the State. However, the State would not process the payment request until provided with a copy of the Corps of Engineers use permit agreement. The Corps of Engineers would not enter into an agreement with the County until a firm development plan had been prepared and submitted for review.

The preparation of a development plan for Fullerton Dam Regional Park was complicated by the inherent difficulty in identifying and undergrounding oil lines and wells. This time consuming planning process was completed and the results forwarded to the Corps of Engineers in February, 1971. The plans were reviewed and approved by the Corps, which then requested a cost and development schedule. This information was sent in May, 1972. Subsequently, the Real Estate Division of the Los Angeles District of the Corps advised the Parks Department an agreement is being prepared and will be forwarded shortly.

Based upon the Corps response, the Parks Department again requested from the State grant payment in the amount of \$382,500. In the interim, the State Department of Parks and Recreation advised extension of the grant project time limits to June, 1973. This extension will allow sufficient time to execute the agreement with the Corps of Engineers, process grant payment vouchers, and conduct audits. If the grant project is not extended for an additional year and is allowed to expire this June 30, 1972, the County will lose \$382,500 in grant monies.

Fullerton Dam 1972-73 ACO Request: The request for fiscal year 1972-73 could be viewed in two parts. First, \$300,000 is carry-over from this year's budget and will be used for undergrounding or consolidating oil and waste lines, and fencing of existing oil wells. Second, \$1,200,000 is requested to fully develop the first increment of 56 acres. In addition to 35 acres  $\pm$  of lawn and trees, the \$1.2 million will buy the following:

1. Park entry structure
2. Concession building
3. Restrooms
4. Maintenance building
5. Picnic facilities (225 picnic units)
6. Paved roads
7. Underground utilities
8. Outlook pavilion
9. Turf amphitheater
10. Tot lot (play apparatus)
11. Automatic irrigation system

Fullerton Dam Construction Development Schedule: The following assumptions are based on the requested budget amount being passed on August 1, 1972. The project would be bid within 30-45 days thereafter, or by September 15, 1972. There would be a thirty-day bid period and then award of the bid. With an estimated construction period of 240 days, and if the weather is not too severe during the winter, the park could be open for business by late spring, approximately June 1, 1973.

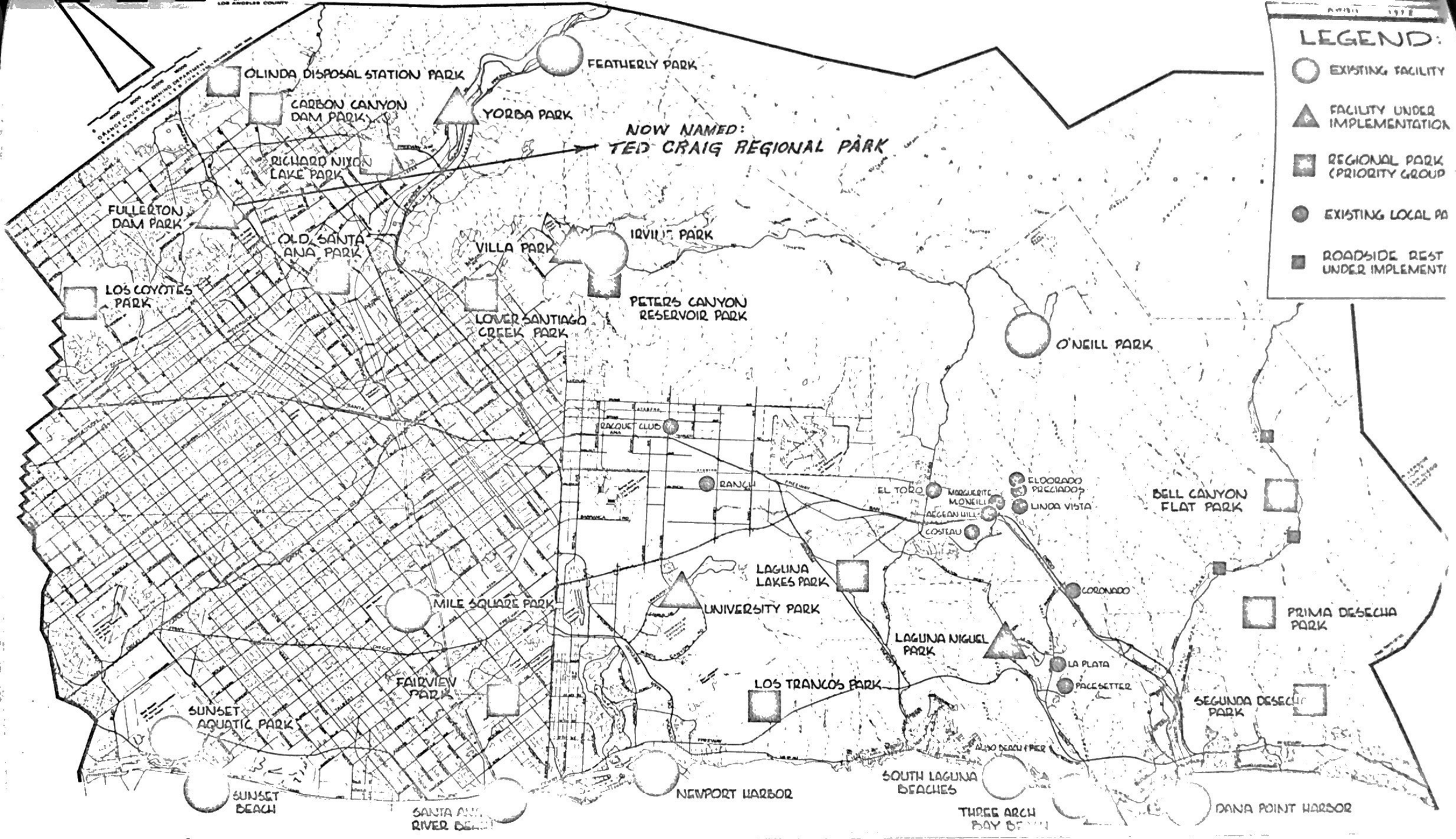

LOCATION: Between State College Boulevard and Associated Road Southerly of Imperial Highway in the City of Fullerton.

DISCUSSION: Of the 126 acres planned for park purposes, 33 acres were purchased by the County in 1969. The remaining required acreage will be leased from the Corps of Engineers. The development schedule is for the park to open in spring of 1973. Construction activity to date includes the undergrounding of oil lines and attendant grading.
